RHAN 1

1. Do you remember the Past Tense forms of 'gwneud'?

Fe / Mi wnes i	Fe / Mi wnaethon ni
Fe / Mi wnest ti	Fe / Mi wnaethoch chi
Fe / Mi wnaeth e(o) / hi	Fe / Mi wnaethon nhw

Remember that 'gwneud' has two meanings

- to do
- to make

Fe **wnes** i'r gwaith. - I **did** the work.
Fe **wnes** i deisen. - I **made** a cake.

Fe wnes i lawer o waith neithiwr.
- I **did** a lot of work last night.

Fe wnaeth Mary deisen ddoe.
- **Mary made** a cake yesterday.

Mi wnaethon ni'r ardd ddydd Sadwrn.
- **We did** the garden on Saturday.

2. We're using 'gwneud' in the past tense, so remember that in negative sentences we use 'ddim' with an indefinite object and 'mo' with a definite one

Wnaeth hi **ddim** teisen ddoe. - She didn't make **a** cake yesterday.
Wnaeth hi **mo'r** gwaith. - She didn't do **the** work.

Wnes i ddim / mo	Wnaethon ni ddim / mo
Wnest ti ddim / mo	Wnaethoch chi ddim / mo
Wnaeth e(o) / hi ddim / mo	Wnaethon nhw ddim / mo

Wnaethon nhw ddim sŏn o gwbl.
- **They didn't make** (any) noise at all.

Wnaeth Cennard mo'r ardd ddoe.
- **Cennard didn't do** the garden yesterday.

3. The question forms are straightforward

The 'Yes' and 'No' replies are always 'Do' and 'Naddo' in this tense

Wnest ti alwad ffôn y bore 'ma? - **Do!**
- **Did you make** a telephone call this morning? - **Yes!**

Wnaethoch chi eich gwaith cartre' neithiwr? - **Naddo!**
- **Did you do** your home work last night? - **No!**

RHAN 2

1. The Past Tense forms of 'gwneud' can be used together with another verb to convey the normal Past Tense

Fe glywais i - Fe wnes i glywed
Mi ffoniodd Tom - Mi wnaeth Tom ffonio
Fe ysgrifennon nhw - Fe wnaethon nhw ysgrifennu

Fe brynais i gar newydd y llynedd.
Fe wnes i brynu car newydd y llynedd.
- I bought (**did buy**) a new car last year.

Mi aeth hi i'r gwely'n gynnar.
Mi wnaeth hi fynd i'r gwely'n gynnar.
- She went (**did go**) to bed early.

2. Negative sentences

Phrynodd Cennard mo'r Western Mail heddiw.
Wnaeth Cennard ddim prynu'r Western Mail heddiw.
- Cennard **didn't buy** the Western Mail today.

Ofynnais i ddim iddi hi.
Wnes i ddim gofyn iddi hi.
- I **didn't ask** her.

3. Questions

Welaist ti John yn y gêm? - Naddo!
Wnest ti weld John yn y gêm? - Naddo!
- **Did you see** John at the game? - No!

Ysgrifennon nhw i ddiolch am yr anrheg? - Do!
Wnaethon nhw ysgrifennu i ddiolch am yr anrheg? - Do!
- **Did they write** to thank for the present? - Yes!

4. As you know, a Soft Mutation follows the short Past Tense forms

Fe fwytais i **ginio** mawr.
Mi brynodd hi **ddau** bapur.
Fe ddarllenon nhw **lyfr** ar y trên.
Gest ti **wyliau** da?

The same rule applies after the 'gwneud' forms - but notice where the mutation occurs

Fe wnes i **f**wyta **c**inio mawr.
Mi wnaeth hi **b**rynu **d**au bapur.
Fe wnaethon nhw **dd**arllen **l**lyfr ar y trêrn.
Wnest ti **g**ael **g**wyliau da?
