RHAN 1

1. llongyfarchiadau - congratulations

Llongyfarchiadau ar lwyddo yn eich arholiadau.

- Congratulations on succeeding in your examinations.

Llongyfarchiadau ar eich llwyddiant.

- Congratulations on your success.

Llongyfarchiadau ar ennill y Loteri.

- Congratulations on winning the Lottery.

Llongyfarchiadau ar eich priodas arian.

- Congratulations on your silver wedding.

Llongyfarchiadau ar enedigaeth eich plentyn / mab / merch.
- Congratulations on the birth of your child /son / daughter.

Llongyfarchiadau i chi.
- Congratulations to you.

2. The personal forms of 'o' are as follows

ohono(f) i	-	of me	ohonon ni	-	of us
ohonot ti	-	of you	ohonoch chi	-	of you
ohono fe	-	of him	ohonyn nhw	-	of them
ohoni hi	-	of her			

i'r ddau ohonoch chi - to the two (both) of you
i'r ddau ohonyn nhw - to the two (both) of them

Llongyfarchiadau i'r ddau ohonoch chi ar eich dyweddiad.
- Congratulations to (the two) both of you on your engagement.

Llongyfarchiadau i'r ddau ohonyn nhw ar basio eu prawf gyrru.
- Congratulations to (the two) both of them on passing their driving test.

RHAN 2

1. Mae hi'n feichiog.
- She is pregnant.

Mae hi'n disgwyl plentyn mewn tri mis.
- She is expecting a child in three months.

Mae hi'n disgwyl efeilliaid.
- She is expecting twins.

2. 'Ail' always precedes the noun and causes Soft Mutation.

yr ail blentyn - the **second** child

Remember to add 'h' when 'ei' (her) precedes a word beginning with a vowel

ei **hail** blentyn

Mae hi'n disgwyl ei **hail** blentyn.
- She is expecting her second child.

3. newydd - just

When used immediately in front of a verb - instead of 'wedi' - it conveys has/have just

Mae hi **wedi** cael - She **has** had
Mae hi **newydd** gael - She **has just** had

Mae hi **newydd gael** ei thrydedd ferch.
- She has **just had** her third daughter.

Mae hi **newydd ddathlu** ei phen-blwydd yn gant oed.
- She has **just celebrated** her hundredth birthday.

Notice that 'newydd' causes a Soft Mutation

Maen nhw newydd **fynd**
- They have **just gone**.

4. 'Trydedd' and 'pedwaredd' must be used with feminine nouns

y **drydedd** ferch
y **bedwaredd** ferch

Remember that both the ordinal and the noun undergo a Soft Mutation after 'y'

Bethan ydy'r **drydedd** ferch.
- Bethan is the third daughter.
